GAME DAY

The Colgate Raiders (1-1) open their home season on Saturday, when they play host to #23 ranked Furman (1-1) in a non-conference game at Andy Kerr Stadium. Kickoff is 1 p.m.

After dropping its opener at Stony Brook, Colgate rebounded for a last second 23-19 win over Coastal Carolina last Sunday. Furman mauled Mars Hill 62-14 in its opener, before losing last Saturday on the road against FBS opponent Virginia Tech, 24-7.

THE SERIES

This is the first meeting between Colgate and Furman.

COLGATE VS. TOP 25 TEAMS

Colgate is 6-7 in its last 13 games against teams ranked in the Top 25 of the FCS. In 2003, they defeated #24 Lehigh, #19 Fordham, #5 Massachusetts, #10 Western Illinois, and #13 Florida Atlantic, before losing to #3 Delaware in the FCS championship game.

Colgate lost to #14 Massachusetts in the 2004 season opener and later to #12 Lehigh. In 2005, they beat #15 UMass 17-14, and lost to #16 Lehigh 50-34 and #1 New Hampshire 55-21. In 2006, they lost to #10 UMass 28-7 and last year to #2 UMass, 35-17.

COLGATE VS. SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

This is the second time that Colgate coach Dick Biddle has played a team out of the Southern Conference. The other game came against Georgia Southern in a 1998 FCS playoff contest won by the Eagles, 49-28.

CARBONE NAMED PATRIOT LEAGUE ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Colgate freshman linebacker Mike Carbone has been named Patriot League Rookie of the Week for his performance in the Coastal Carolina game. The 6-foot, 215-pounder led the Raiders with nine tackles and came up with a big play late in a last-second 23-19 victory over Coastal. He tackled a Coastal runner one-yard short of a first down on a second down play on Coastal's final possession, forcing a punt that led to Colgate's winning score. Carbone made five solo tackles on the day.

WHAT IS A FOOTBALL PLAYER

A football player is a wonderful creature - you can criticize him, but you can't discourage him. You can defeat his team, but you can't make him quit. You can get him out of the game, but you can't get him out of football. Might as well admit it - be you an alumnus, coach or fan - he is your personal representative on the field, your symbol of fair and hard play. He may not be an All-American, but is an example of the American way. He is judged, not for his race, not for his religion, nor for his social standing, or not for his finances, but by the democratic yardstick of how well he blocks, tackles, and sacrifices individual glory for the overall success of the team - by Charles Loftus, 1951, Yale University Sports Information Director.

CAPTAINS ELECTED

Colgate head coach Dick Biddle announced that tri-captains have been elected for the 2008 season. They are senior tailback **Jordan Scott**, senior quarterback **Alex Relph** and senior offensive tackle **Nick Hennessey**.

COLGATE HEAD COACH

Colgate head coach **Dick Biddle** is in his 13th season with the Raiders. He has an overall record of 96-47 for a .671 winning percentage. In 2003, he was named the American Football Coaches Association Division I-AA National Coach of the Year, and three times in his career he has been Patriot League Coach of the Year.

His Patriot League and overall winning percentage is the highest of any coach who has coached eight or more seasons in the league.

Biddle is the first Colgate coach to post 10 straight winning seasons (1996-2005) and the first Colgate coach to record nine straight seasons with seven or more victories (1997-2005). He has won seven or more games in 10 of his 12 seasons with the Raiders.

WINNINGEST FOOTBALL COACH OF ALL-TIME

Dick Biddle is the winningest football coach in the 118 years of Colgate football with 96 victories.

Biddle owns the Patriot League records for wins in league games (57) and overall victories (96).

COACHING CHANGES

Steve Szabo is Colgate's new defensive coordinator and linebacker coach coming to the program from the University of Michigan where he was linebacker coach. He has 12 years of experience in the National Football League. Also hired is defensive assistant **Dave Uimonen** and running backs coach **Kade Rannings**.

COLGATE PLAYERS TABBED WITH PRESEASON HONORS

Jordan Scott was tabbed a preseason FCS All-America by The Sporting News; second team preseason All-America by Consensus Draft Services; and third team preseason by College Sporting News.

Phil Steele's Football Magazine named offensive tackle **Nick Hennessey** second team preseason All-America, while he joined Scott, offensive tackle **Steve Jonas** and defensive back **Wayne Moten** on the Patriot League preseason first team. Wide receiver **Pat Simonds**, offensive guard **Rich Rosabella**, defensive tackle **Paul Mancuso** and defensive back **Mike Barry** were second team selections.

Hennessey was also named second team All-America by The Sports Network.

SCOTT ON WALTER PAYTON WATCH LIST

For the second straight season, **Jordan Scott** has been named to the Walter Payton Award watch list. The award goes to the outstanding player in the Football Championship Subdivision.

NATION'S LEADING RUSHER

Jordan Scott led the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) last season in rushing with 170.45 yards per game. He was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, given to the most outstanding player in the FCS.

SCOTT APPROACHING ELITE COMPANY

Jordan Scott will attempt to join only seven other FCS runners with his fourth consecutive 1,000-yard rushing season this fall, joining Jerry Azumah of New Hampshire, Adrian Peterson of Georgia Southern, Alonzo Coleman of Hampton, Clifton Dawson of Harvard, Steve Baylark of Massachusetts, Scott Phaydavong of Drake and Donald Chapman of Tennessee-Martin. Jordan Scott enters the 2008 season in second place on the school's all-time rushing list with 4,663 yards. He needs 557 yards for first place.

CAREER RUSHING IN THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

Jordan Scott set or tied five Patriot League season or career records in 2007, including a season-best 170.45 rushing yards per game. This season he has a chance to go out as one of the top players in league history. Scott is 172 yards away from breaking the all-time Patriot League rushing mark of 4,834 yards held by Lafayette's Erik Marsh (1991-94). He is also within 53 points of becoming the league's all-time leading scorer. He has 14 consecutive 100-yard rushing games and 25 total 100-yard efforts, both three games away from tying the league marks. Scott's 1,062 carries is a Patriot League mark and 153 from a Division I record. Scott has already tied league records with six 200-yard games and three 1,000-yard seasons in his career.

Colgate has five current football players who's fathers played football for the Raiders. Senior quarterback **Alex Relph's** dad, Bob, played between 1974-77; freshman offensive lineman **Greg Kafaf's** dad, John, played between 1977-80; senior placekicker **Ryan Dowgin's** dad, Mike, played between 1972-75; freshman offensive lineman **Brian Merrifield's** dad, Jim, played between 1971-74; and freshman defensive lineman **Bryce Mongeon's** dad, Tory, played between 1979-82.

RELPH OUT DEFINITELY

Colgate's starting quarterback **Alex Relph** will be sidelined indefinitely with an ankle injury suffered with 7:40 left in the first quarter against Stony Brook.

FIVE IN SEVEN

Since moving to cornerback late last season, junior **Wayne Moten** has made five interceptions in seven games. He had his fifth in the opening against Stony Brook leading to a field goal. Last year, Moten tied for the Patriot League lead in interceptions with four.

COLGATE NOTEBOOK (COASTAL CAROLINA GAME)

Adrien Schriefer's two touchdown catches against Coastal were the first two of his career ... Sophomore quarterback **Greg Sullivan**, making his first career start, completed 14-of-22 passes for 110 yards and one TD, and carried 13 times for 70 yards ... For the second straight game, junior wide receiver **Pat Simonds** caught six passes.

Sophomore wide receiver **Doug Rosnick** had a personal-best three catches against Coastal ... freshman linebacker **Mike Carbone** was the leading tackler with nine including five solo efforts ... cornerback **Wayne Moten** had a fumble recovery.
